James Dean (1931-1955), American Actor

James Dean is perhaps best known for his starring roles in Rebel without a Cause, East of Eden, and Giant. His film career abruptly ended when Dean was killed in a car accident at the age of 24.

Margaret Mackall Smith Taylor (1788-1852), First Lady

Margaret Mackall Smith Taylor was the wife of President Zachary Taylor. It has been said that she was delicate and tender, although she began her marriage in rough and difficult circumstances.

T. S. Eliot (1888-1965), American-born British Poet

Nobel prize winning poet T.S. Eliot is considered one of the most significant poets of the twentieth century. His most famous works are "The Love Song Of J. Alfred Prufrock" and "The Waste Land".

Jacques Cartier (1491-1557), French Explorer

On his first voyage to try and find a western trade route to Asia, Jacques Cartier instead stumbled upon what is present day Quebec. He is the first known European to explore Canada. In total, Cartier made 3 voyages to explore and settle Canada.

Relationship: Distant (20) Great Grandfather

Maurice "Rocket" Richard (1921-2000), Hockey Player

Hockey player Maurice "Rocket" Richard was the first to score 50 goals in one season, doing so in 50 games, and the first to score 500 goals in a career. He finished his career with 544 goals in the regular season, with 82 in the playoffs.

Jack Kerouac (1922-1969), American Author

Jack Kerouac (born Jean-Louis Lebris de Kerouac) was from a French-American home living in the Beat Generation. His innovative writings include "On the Road" and "Book of Dreams".

Franz Liszt (1811-1886), Hungarian Composer

Very famous during his day until the present, Franz Liszt was a composer of the 19th century. One of his most famous works is "Piano Sonata in B Minor".

Tom Landry (1924-2000), Football player, head coach

Football defensive back Tom Landry played for the New York Giants and later became the first head coach of the Dallas Cowboys, winning two Super Bowl titles

Louis Pasteur (1822-1895), French Microbiologist and Chemist

Louis Pasteur is famous for "pasteurization," a means of preventing milk from going sour. He also invented the first vaccine for rabies.

Gustav Mahler (1860-1911), Bohemian/Austrian Composer

Both a composer and a conductor, Gustav Mahler was an important part of the post-romantic period in music. He composed both songs and symphonies, and died while working on his tenth symphony.

F. Scott Fitzgerald (1896-1940), American Author

Francis Scott Fitzgerald is considered to be one of the greatest American writers of the 20th century. He wrote "The Great Gatsby" and "This Side of Paradise".

Jefferson "Soapy" Smith (1860-1898), American Outlaw

Jefferson Randolph "Soapy" Smith was a con man and gangster. He got his nickname for his crown swindling strategy of selling soap with money stuck to it.

Robert Morris (1734-1806), Pennsylvania Representative

Prior to signing The Declaration of Independence, The Constitution, and The Articles of Confederation; Robert Morris borrowed money to pay Washington's troops during the Revolutionary War.

Henri Charles Wilfrid Laurier (1841-1919), Former Prime Minister

Henry Charles Wilfred Laurier was the 7th Prime Minister of Canada. Considered one of Canada's greatest statesmen, Laurier is known for his policies of conciliation and for nation building.

James Matthew Barrie (1860-1937), Scottish Novelist

James Matthew Barrie wrote the stories of Peter Pan and The Lost Boys. His college acquaintances include Arthur Conan Doyle and Robert Lewis Stevenson, with whom he wrote for the university newspaper.

Louis Stephen St Laurent (1882-1973), Former Prime Minister

Louis St. Laurent was the 12th Prime Minister of Canada. Remembered as shy, reserved, dignified, and grandfatherly, he demanded hard work of his staff and also of himself.

Pierre Elliot Trudeau (1919-2000), Former Prime Minister

Pierre Elliot Trudeau held the position of Prime Minister of Canada longer than anyone since William Lion Mackenzie King in 1948. Trudeau's style and attitude as Prime Minister was all his own.

Juan Cortina (1824-1894), Mexican Outlaw

Juan Nepomuceno Cortina Goseacochea led the paramilitary force against the U.S. military in the first and second Cortina Wars.

Jean Jacques Rousseau (1712-1778), French Philosopher

Jean-Jacques Rousseau, a French philosopher, was highly influential in the French revolution and is remembered for his idea of a "social contract." His theories and philosophies are still taught today.

(Francisco) Pancho Villa (1878-1923), Mexican revolutionary

Doroteo Arango Arámbula, or Pancho Villa, an uneducated peasant, became one of the foremost and most famous generals of the Mexican Revolution.

Edvard Grieg (1843-1907), Norwegian Composer

A composer during the Romantic period, Edvard Grieg is best known for his play "Peer Gynt", and "Piano Concerto in A Minor". His music was often inspired by Norwegian folk music.

Alexandre Dumas (1802-1870), French Author

French writer Alexandre Dumas is known for his historical novels and was the most widely read French Author at the time. His most famous works include "The Count of Monte Cristo".

William Thomson (1824-1907), Irish-Scottish Scientist

William Thomson, 1st Baron Kelvin, was an Irish Scottish mathematician and scientist known for his contributions to the studies of thermodynamics and electricity.

Felix Mendelssohn (1809-1847), German Composer

Jakob Ludwig Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy, or Felix Mendelssohn, was a composer during the Romantic period. A prolific composer, Mendelssohn was very popular during his day and remains a staple in classical music history.
