

Late Edward Merck, Who
Died Late on Wednes-
day Afternoon.

AT ST. FRANCIS HOSPITAL

Was Born in Alsace and Came to
This Country After the
Prussian War.

His Doctor's Bed.

The long illness of Edward Merck ended in death at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon at St. Francis hospital. He had suffered with a disease of the heart for a long time and a fortnight before his death was taken to St. Francis Hospital for treatment, although it was not suspected that his marked improvement could be brought about. He had suffered with a weak heart all his life, the result of an attack of rheumatic inflammation in his boyhood. In fact, the physician who examined him in the old country prior to his departure for America did not think the crisis would stand the sea voyage.

"Ed" Merck was one of the best known men in the city. He had been engaged in the management of the catering business for nearly thirty years and three have brought him into contact with a large proportion of the population. Being a man of not only superior intelligence but of exceeding education and having represented everywhere as a man of the greatest integrity, he enjoyed the esteem and friendship of his customers to a very unusual degree. His favorite place was the resort of all classes. The long disorder was never tolerated in any place with which he was connected. He had received the elements of a classical education at Strasburg, but his greater education was independent of a university. He was well versed in English, German and French.

Mr. Merck was fifty-five years old, having been born on Feb. 21, 1850, in Schleidenberg, Alsace. He was there born a subject of the debatable land between France and Germany. Always at the time of his birth belonged to
