(National has no Citation) Research Information: During World War II, Fredrick Darragh was one of the Pilots that flew "The Hump," as the Allied air transport of materials from India to China was termed. These supply efforts required dangerous flights over the Himalayan Mountains, and Darragh received the Distinguished Flying Cross for his service. Other honors and awards included: the 1962 Pilot of The Year by the National Pilot's Association; Pilot Wings from the Chinese Air Force in 1988 and in 1999 he was inducted into the Arkansas Aviation Hall of Fame.
