Irving, Peter Stoddard, M.D. Long time Hollywood physician Peter Stoddard Irving passed away on January 9, 2007, surrounded by family in Lady Lake, Florida. Peter was born on February 9, 1932 in Passaic, New Jersey, the son of Albert and Adele Irving. He attended Male High School in Louisville, Kentucky and went on to complete an undergraduate degree from the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee where he was graduated Phi Beta Kappa. He received his medical degree from Northwestern University and completed his internship and residency at Charity Hospital in New Orleans. He served in the Air Force in Evreux, France from 1959-61, after which he returned to New Orleans in private practice. Peter began his private practice in Internal Medicine in Hollywood, Florida in 1966 where he provided dedicated and personal care to his patients until his retirement in 1995. He was on staff at both Memorial Hospital of Hollywood and Hollywood Medical Center, where he served as Chief of Staff. Peter and his former wife Ginger were respected members of the Hollywood community where they raised three children. He was a long standing member of Rotary International, an avid golfer, a lover of good food and wine, and the occasional margarita. Peters fondest memories were of the time spent with his family and friends at his vacation home in Bonita Beach, Florida. On his retirement from practice he and his wife of 16 years, Anne Marie, moved to New England for several years prior to settling in Central Florida. Peter is survived by his wife Anne Marie; his sister Adele Weber and brother-in-law Don of Chester, VA; son Rob of Ft. Myers; son Brian and his wife Helen of Charlotte, NC; daughter Amy Ising and her husband Ted of Chapel Hill, NC; and five grandchildren.
