Colonel, having served 27 years. From 1971 to 1983, Charles worked for Polk County Commissioners, as Project Officer for Federal Public Service Employment Programs. He also worked for EEA and CETA programs including Hardy, Highland, De Soto, Okeechobee and Polk County. He was later Director of the Aging Services for Polk County.
