## **Deceased Name: David Glen Ramsey**

David Glen Ramsey, a 69-year-old resident of Burley, passed away Tuesday, Sept. 19, 2006, at St. Luke's Magic Valley Regional Medical Center in Twin Falls, following a brief battle with cancer.

David was born on July 11, 1937, in Twin Falls, the fifth of seven children of Arthur and Myrtle Etherington Ramsey. He was raised and attended schools in Burley, where he was active in band.

He graduated from Burley High School in 1955. He married Carol Jacobsen on May 29, 1955, in Elko, Nev., and they were sealed as a family in the Idaho Falls LDS Temple on May 6, 1960. David was an active member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, where he held several leadership positions in the bishopric, Sunday school, priesthood and Boy Scouts. David and Carol served in the South Dakota Rapid City Mission, where they were assigned to work at Sixth Crossing and Martin's Cove, Wyo., for 18 months.

David joined the United States Air Force in 1955, where he was stationed at Parks Air Force Base in California, Keesler Air Force Base in Mississippi and Evreux Air Force Base in France. He was honorably discharged in 1959. He went to work at Ramsey Produce with his father and brothers. After Ramsey Produce closed in 1984, he worked for Gordon Paving for 19 years. David was a member of the Cassia County Mounted Sheriff's Posse for 20 years and also served on the Pomerelle and National Ski Patrol. He enjoyed horses, cowboy poetry and camping with his family and friends.

He is survived by his wife, Carol of Burley; his children, Kevin (Karen) of Stansbury Park, Utah, Karen Ramsey Bates of Boise, Brent (Pam) of Salt Lake City, Utah, Jason (Anne) of Pocatello and Aaron (Melissa) of Blackfoot; 22 grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren; his brothers, Lloyd (Nancy) of Danville, Calif., Douglas of Las Vegas, Nev., and Art (Karen) of Burley. He is preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Gordon and Bob; and a sister, Dorothy Strout.

The funeral will be held at 1 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 23, 2006, at the Burley 2nd, 4th and 10th Ward Chapel of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 515 E. 16th St. in Burley, with Bishop Sheldon Sorensen officiating. Burial will be in the Pleasant View Cemetery.
